Sunday, March 8	<i>Sunday of St. Gregory Palamas</i> (Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great, 10:00 am)

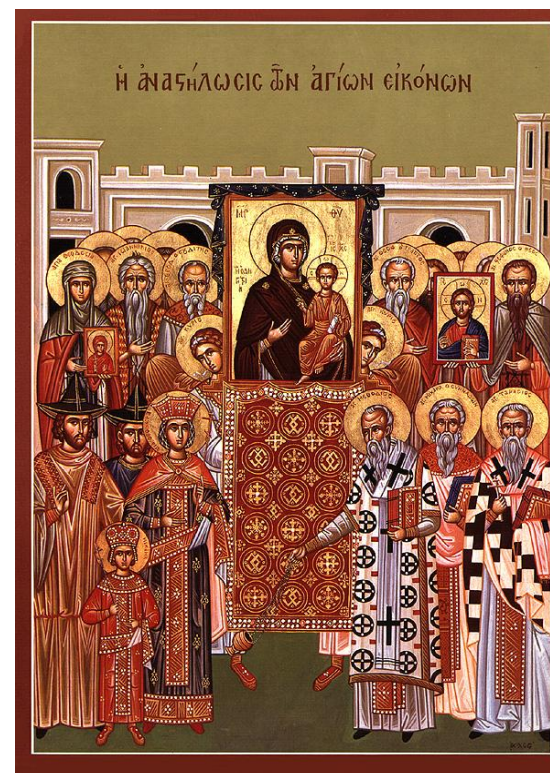
