Sunday, April 21	<i>Sunday of St. Mary of Egypt</i> (Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great, 10:00 am)

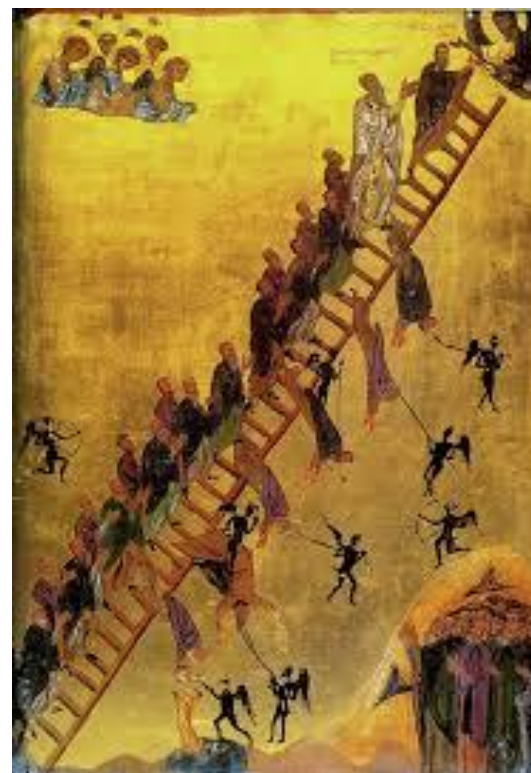
