Sunday November 1	21 st Sunday after Pentecost (Divine Liturgy, 10:00 am)

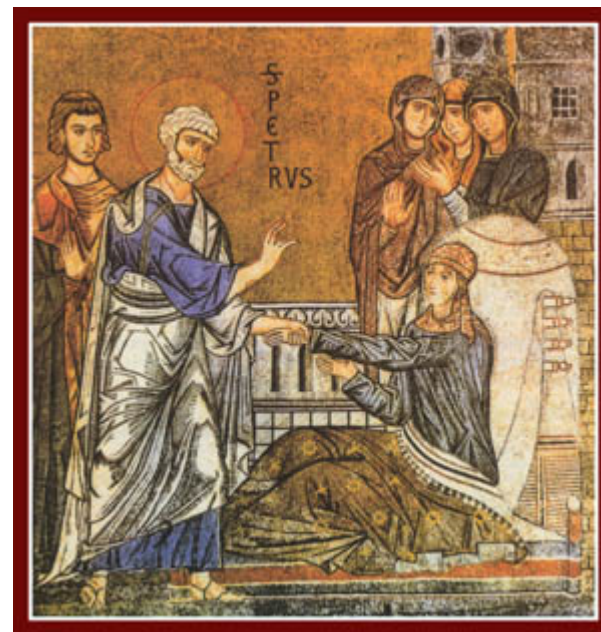
