Sunday, November 13	22 nd Sunday After Pentecost (Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, 10:00 am)

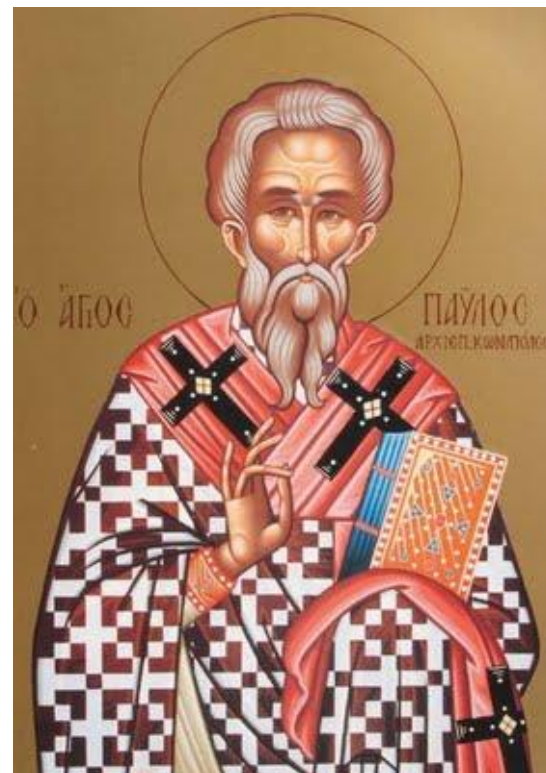
