Monday, November 21	8:00 a.m. – <i>Divine Liturgy for the Feast of the Entry of the Theotokos into the Temple</i>

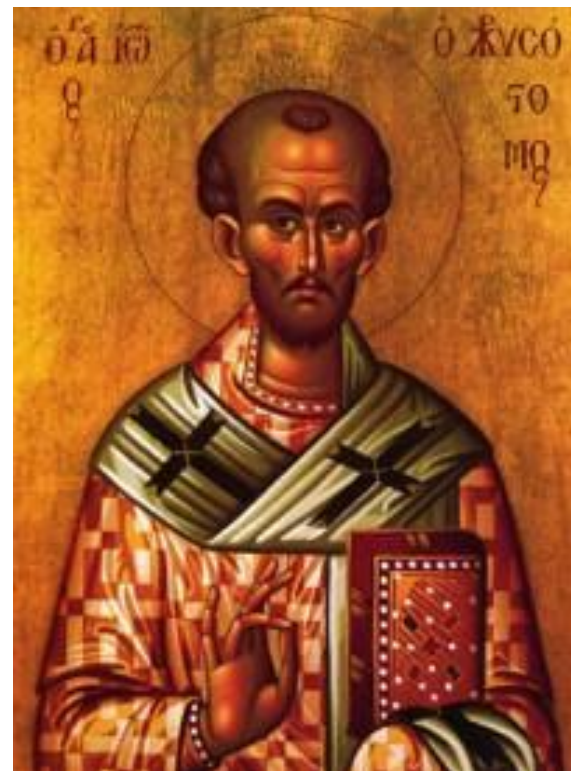
