Sunday December 13	Sunday of the Forefathers (Divine Liturgy, 10:00 am)

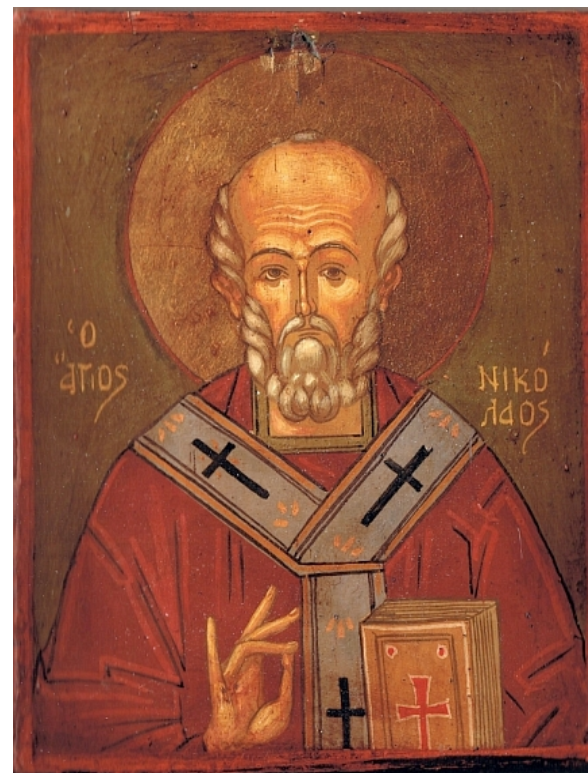
